

Trades Make Big Gains in WV Statehouse Elections

While the outcome of the Presidential election has taken up much of the national attention, the state elections in West Virginia are a signal of progress for the trades.

The official results show that 55 out of 63 Building Trades-endorsed candidates were victorious in their elections (detailed results on page 3).

Republicans increased their numbers in both the House and Senate. However, every Democratic incumbent protected their seat in the legislature as well.

According to officials at the WV Building and Construction Trades, the outcome of this election was an overwhelming success in terms of building legislative support for the trades.

"Not only did we protect our Democratic and Republican friends who have stood with us in the past, but we also saw more labor-friendly Republicans elected this cycle than we have ever seen before," said George Capel, Government Relations Director for the West Virginia Building and Construction Trades Council.

Capel says that this election resulted in great gains for the West Virginia Republican Labor Caucus, an organization which was instrumental in stopping cuts to unemployment

Republican Candidates Increase Numbers on Nearly Every Level of Government

After every vote was counted and the 2024 election concluded, the official results show that West Virginia Republicans have increased their margins in virtually every aspect of government.

Aside from certain local city and county races in the state's remaining

democratic strongholds, Republican candidates increased their majorities in the WV House and state Senate as well as sweeping every Congressional and statewide elected race.

In the West Virginia House of Delegates, the partisan split is now 91-9 in favor of Republicans, while in the West Virginia Senate the split is 32-2.

According to results on the West Virginia Secretary of State's website, on average Republican candidates won their elections with roughly 70% of the vote (average across all elections). "This is why our work in supporting the West Virginia Republican Labor Caucus is so important," said George Capel, Government Relations Director for the West Virginia Building and Construction Trades Council. "Our state's voters have giv-



Jobs Act over the past three years.

"It goes without saying that we partner with lawmakers on both sides of the aisle. However, building support within the Republican Labor Caucus gives us a lot of hope for the future."

The new numbers in the 100-member House of Delegates chamber are 91-9 in favor of Republicans. In the 34-member Senate, the split is 32 Republicans to 2 remaining Democrats.

The two Democratic seats in the WV Senate are now held by Senator Mike Woelfel (D-Cabell), who was not up for reelection this cycle, and incoming Senator Joey Garcia (D-Marion) who won the seat of now former Senator Mike Caputo.

Interestingly, Senator Garcia's uncle, now Delegate Rick Garcia (D-Marion), won Senator Joey Garcia's old House seat that he vacated to run for Senate.

Delegate Rick Garcia is the only non-incumbent Democrat to win an election to the House of Delegates this cycle.

Now that the election is over, Capel believes it is time to focus on the upcoming legislative session, which begins on Wednesday, February 12, 2025.

"We look forward to working with our friends in the legislature, who have been with us for years, and also to developing new relationships with incoming lawmakers as well," said Capel.

"Preparations are already underway so we can hit the ground running this session. As always, we will do everything we can to support all our crafts to ensure there is a bright future for the trades." ■

Wheeling Parking Garage Completed



Earlier this month, a new fully automated 6-story parking structure located at the corner of Market and 11th streets in Downtown Wheeling officially opened to the public.

With 290 spaces, the facility also has charging stations for electrical vehicles as well as bicycle parking.

The ground level of the parking structure has 10,000 square feet of street level retail and commercial space available for lease.

The project was completed in roughly two and a half years, with an original groundbreaking ceremony for the project held in April 2022.

The Mills Group served as the project architect; Walter P. Moore, parking consultant; CMTA, MEP; Hays Landscaping Architecture Studio, civil engineer; Carl Walker Construction, contractor; and Western Alliance Bank, financing.

en Republicans a mandate to govern. It is imperative for us to work with them-and everyone on both sides of the aisle-to advance our cause and show once and for all that supporting the trades is not a partisan issue."

The West Virginia Republican Labor Caucus, referenced by Capel, was formed in 2021 with only 10 members in the state legislature. According to their Executive Director, former West Virginia House of Delegates member Guy Ward (R-Marion), their numbers have grown significantly since that time.

"As far as we can tell, it seems as if we have picked up 10 new members after the 2024 election," said Ward. "We're still trying to wrap our heads

around the results and get everyone on the same page. However, we expect to have approximately 40 members in the House and Senate during the upcoming legislative session."

Ward says that this growth is part of a larger trend of Republicans beginning to work with labor unions to enact policies that support working families on the national level.

"What's happening in Charleston is reflective of what is happening on the national scene," said Ward. "I think we will see start to see more labor-supporting Republicans going forward."
